Pool Permits Required! Important Information



In January 2008, the definition of a swimming pool changed. The definition was changed which defines a

swimming pool as ANY structure intended for swimming or recreational bathing that can hold 24 inches or more in depth. This includes in-ground, above and on-ground pools, hot tubs and spas. This definition includes the commonly used "inflatable pool" that is 24 inches or more in depth. Zoning and construction permits are required.

If you recently installed a swimming pool and have not received a Zoning Permit, Construction Permit, necessary inspections and a Certificate of Approval please contact the construction department immediately to avoid violations/fines.

Safety is Priority! If you currently have a permit for a swimming pool, you must contact the Construction Office to schedule your final inspection BEFORE you plan on using your pool.
